The **ON-Q<sup>\*</sup> Pain Relief System** is a small disposable pump filled with a local anesthetic medication to relieve your pain after surgery. It continuously delivers local anesthetic to or near the surgical site through specially designed catheters – Providing patients up to 5 days of targeted pain relief after surgery. The ON-Q\* pump is indicated to significantly decrease pain and narcotic use when compared to narcotic only pain management.

The **ambIT**® **Electronic Pain Control System** is a small and light weight pump that flows local anesthetic medication to relieve your pain after surgery. It continuously or intermittently delivers medication that blocks pain in the area of your procedure.
